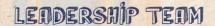

A Message from Tu Nidito's Board of Directors ...

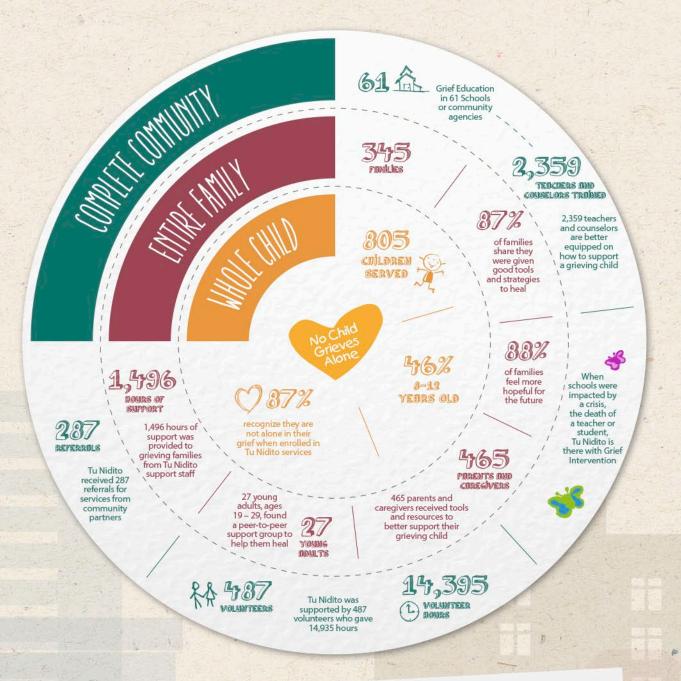
Tu Nidito offers important, unduplicated services – it helps children and families to heal during unimaginable circumstances of serious illness and death. Many people walk around with an invisible mask of grief and no one knows about it. At Tu Nidito, we allow these masks to be revealed and provide the tools and resources children and their families need to work through their grief. Many of these families become so empowered that after closing from group, they come back to volunteer and be there for another child. One of these special people is our own Adriana Rincon, a former Tu Nidito family, turned volunteer, now serving as President of Tu Nidito's Board of Directors. Adriana's family's story is a testimony to Tu Nidito's mission going full-circle, as we move toward the vision that no child grieves alone. Adriana shares...

On January 12, 2008, our lives were tragically altered. Our 14-year-old son was killed by a drunk driver. His sisters Gaby, 15, and Julissa, 7, were left with the trauma of the death of a sibling and the challenge of trying to make sense of it. We reached out and sought help anywhere we could, and thankfully found Tu Nidito.

Tu Nidito provided a haven for our daughters and family where we felt safe and supported. Meeting other kids their age and interacting with them through the activities offered by Tu Nidito provided a sense of normalcy. Our children were happier and more hopeful after every evening spent at Tu Nidito. As parents, we found light during a very dark time and helped ourselves by trying to help our daughters.

We spent three years receiving support from Tu Nidito, attending the bereavement support group every two weeks. After we closed from group, Jose, my husband, and Gaby, volunteered as facilitators, Jose working with the adult group and Gaby spending her time with the littles, ages 3 1/2 - 7. As a family, we enjoyed chairing the Remarkable Celebration for three years, where Tu Nidito honors five Remarkable Moms in the community, an honor I humbly accepted in 2011. After five years on the board, I happily accepted the role as the President of the Board of Directors. I feel honored and privileged to lead this outstanding organization forward and help others come full circle, because I know first-hand how important it is to have grief support.





Addressing serious illness and death in an age appropriate way is essential to healthy healing. When left unaddressed, unresolved childhood grief can lead to serious long term complications including both mental and physical issues. It is important for children to have the support of others going through similar situations so they learn that they are not alone. Tu Nidito's programs focus on this by normalizing a child's life while grieving, increasing healthy family communication and reducing social isolation.
