

What started out as a dream for a group of visionaries who recognized that seriously ill children needed support beyond the walls of a hospital, has grown into a movement—one unique in our city, our state, and most of the country. I hope that Tu Nidito's founders know that their groundbreaking work has improved the lives of literally thousands and thousands of children throughout the years.

During that first year of services in 1996, Tu Nidito supported 11 seriously ill children and their families. This year, in 2021, we provided support to 845 children and their family members, all grieving a serious medical condition or death of a loved one.

Along the way, Tu Nidito's community has grown to include an expanding circle of board members, staff, volunteers, organizations, and collaborators. So many beautiful stories shaped Tu Nidito into the powerful resource it is today. If you're receiving this, you've been a part of that journey. I hope you know how grateful we are to have you in our corner.

We couldn't do this work without our donors, whose contributions have ensured that no child in our community has to grieve alone.

Just like in 1996, we start each budget year at zero and ask ourselves: "how are we going to raise the money we need to continue to be here for anyone who needs us?" And every year, even during the pandemic—a time when we had to cancel events and pivot our services to continue to meet the needs in our community—our donors have come through.

So I'd like to thank you all, again, for 25 incredible years of truly making a difference. You've brought hope and comfort to the lives of grieving children, teens, young adults and their family members.

We are not finished yet. There is so much more to do. And with your continued partnership, we will ensure that there will always be a Tu Nidito for those who need it.


